CANADIAN ART OF THE FIRST WORLD WAR

The 100th anniversary of the First World War is a headline story for Canadians because of the historic role this event played in our country's emergence as a nation. Often left out of the story are the artists who recorded their experiences of the war.

The Canadian War Museum is proud to present some of these unique visual testimonies in a new touring exhibition Witness - Canadian Art of the First World War. This evocative art display of massive battle canvases and tiny trench sketches brings celebrated Canadian painters together with soldier artists whose work has never before been displayed. Visitors will be gripped by this little-known legacy and find themselves reflecting on the tragedy and spectacle that was the First World War.

Many Canadian soldiers in the First World War were designers, sign painters, draughtsmen and architects.

In the trenches, prisoner-of-war camps and behind the lines, they recorded their experiences of the conflict on scraps of paper and in pocket-sized sketchbooks. Well-known Canadian artists André Biéler, Randolph Hewton, Henrietta Mabel May, Homer Watson and Frederick Varley also memorialized the First World War on canvas and paper and many of their compositions were later shown in post-war international war art exhibitions. *Witness - Canadian Art of the First World War* combines for the first time official and unofficial perspectives on the Great War as expressed in art.

In depicting the towns where they were billeted, their everyday tasks, factory workers, battlefields and bombed houses, these artists showed what they wanted to be remembered about the First World War. In so doing, they left an indelible and remarkable legacy for all Canadians.
