**JOHN ABRAHAM CHAMBERLAIN, MM**

— Citation for the Military Medal —

*"This man was employed as a company runner during the operation against Passchendaele Ridge on November 6, 1917, he acted with great gallantry and determination in carrying messages between Vine Cottages and Battalion Headquarters, continuously for 36 hours.*

*The distance to be traversed between these two points was about 1000 yards over open country which was under a terrific artillery fire. On one occasion he started out with two other runners both of whom became casualties, but Pte. Chamberlain with great courage delivered the message to its destination alone. His untiring energy and splendid heroism was a magnificent example and inspiration to everyone he came in touch with".*

On November 6, 1917 at the Battle of Passchendaele,  
the 3rd Battalion earned the following awards:

One Victoria Cross  
Two Distinguished Conduct Medals  
Twenty nine Military Medals  
Four Bars to the Military Medal

The Battalion suffered 35% casualties;  
3 Officers Killed — 6 Wounded  
61 Other Ranks Killed — 22 Missing — 148 Wounded

Four Military Crosses — One Bar to the Military Cross  
Two Distinguished Conduct Medals  
Twenty-nine Military Medals — Four Bars to the Military Medal

The Battalion suffered 35% casualties;  
3 Officers Killed — 6 Wounded  
61 Other Ranks Killed — 22 Missing — 148 Wounded
