
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




Russia forms part of the "Triple Entente, being united to France by close defensive alliance, and to Great Britain by entente cordiale founded on separate conventions dealing with Persian and other affairs. The Russian Army is recruited by conscription. 

carries in his kit, or sewn into the corner of his jacket, a "first field dressing." The dressing consists of one bandage 2½ yards long. A small pad of bleached cotton gauze is stitched to the bandage about 18 inches from one end. While in the trenches a soldier may receive a wound which is not serious enough to make it necessary for him to go to the hospital, and is yet bad enough to need instant dressing.
