# VIMY

BATTLE, MEMORIAL, ICON

A TRAVELLING EXHIBITION PRODUCED BY THE CANADIAN WAR MUSEUM

For Canadians, Vimy Ridge is layered with multiple meanings. It was not only a battlefield victory at the height of the First World War in France, but is also the site of Canada's best-known memorial to the war and an enduring symbol of evolving nationhood. This new graphic presentation richly illustrates these themes as we mark the battle's 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary and the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Canadian Confederation.

The journey begins with a look at one of the bloodiest battles in Canadian military history. Capturing the ridge resulted in more than 10,000 Canadian casualties in four days. Following a look at the battle itself, the exhibition shifts to First World War commemorations, including the iconic Canadian National Vimy Memorial, designed by sculptor and architect Walter Allward. Finally, the exhibition considers how several generations of Canadians have come to view the Battle of Vimy Ridge as an important national symbol, and one of this country's foundational stories.

#### CONTENT

The exhibition consists of double-sided display panel units and contains no artifacts.
